We aren't singing this wonderful old hymn on Easter Sunday but we should know the words. I'll be playing it during communion as a thoughtful, meditative song to enhance our prayers. It was written by Cecil Frances Humphries (b. Redcross, County Wicklow, Ireland, 1818; Londonderry, Ireland, 1895) who wrote poetry in her school's journal. In 1850 she married Rev. William Alexander, who later became the Anglican primate (chief bishop) of Ireland. She showed her concern for disadvantaged people by traveling many miles each day to visit the sick and the poor, providing food, warm clothes, and medical supplies. She and her sister also founded a school for the deaf. Thank you for your wonderful poem, Mrs. Humphries.
