

On Sunday July 25<sup>th</sup> St. Matthew's had their last and final Parish Visit from Bishop Marty Field. Bishop Field will officially retire on September 13, 2021 after being the Bishop of the Diocese of West Missouri for a little over ten years. Only two months later in November, he has been asked to come back to preside over the opening of the 132<sup>nd</sup> Annual Convention of the Diocese of West Missouri.

Bishop Marty led the Eucharist and delivered the sermon. Afterwards a small reception was held in the Fellowship Hall where he and his wife Donna were presented a \$150 Gift Card to go out to dinner. The Bishop spoke to the congregation and answered questions, then met for a short time with the Vestry to discuss and answer any questions they might have.

The wagons made deep "swales" in the landscape as they rolled along the trail. We were able to get out at the Wieduwilt Swales and actually still see where the wagons traveled hundreds of years ago. As we traveled on we passed by Schumacher Park. Hart Grove Creek, and ending at New Santa Fe. There was a cemetery there that had a lot of old, old graves. One of the oldest was dated 1818, but the most interesting one was dated 1898 and simply said "The Horse Thief".



This was the end of the trail for this "wagon train caravan", but a nice reminder for all of us about the upcoming 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Santa Fe Trail through Missouri.

We thank and appreciate Jim Laney for offering to guide us through this little bit of our past history as a State. It was fun and educational!

## **Community of Chaplains**

As one of your chaplains, it has been a joy to learn about St. Benedict and his Rule, which is the foundation of our service as chaplains. I was delighted to find a reference to Benedict in my own Community of Christ publication, "Herald" for November/December 2020. (I'm a little bit behind on my reading!) In an article titled, "Trust What is Being Born: Always, We Begin Again" by Larry McGuire, he shares his own experience with "The Rule of St. Benedict" by John McQuiston. After coming across another reference to The Rule, he was captured by the phrase, "Always, we begin again." At the time, Larry's reaction was that this must have been a frustrating "rule" for the monks, since it implied that nothing ever got accomplished! However, he said that he came "to realize they [Always, we begin again] aren't simple words of a phrase, but a rhythm of life with which to engage over and over. Always, we begin again." The article was written for the Advent season and Larry went on to say, "This is a season of expectation and anticipation. This is a season of **defiant hope** [emphasis mine]. Always, we begin again. This is a season of trust in what is being born."

I was struck by how very much this phrase, "Always, we begin again," applies to St. Matthews! AND that **defiant hope** is a powerful way to approach our own mission...whatever that may prove to be. We are in a time of transition, again. We need to have powerful, defiant hope that God is at work in us and through us and for us. Always, we begin again.
