

Good Bye Zoom



After much difficulty, we're happy to announce that our YouTube Sunday Livestream is now up and running on a regular basis. You may recall that we had much difficulty getting our Optics camera,OBS streaming software and YouTube Creator to work well together. We had it going, but continually had sound issues crop up. Turns out our equalizer into which we plugged the sound cable was going bad. Thanks to Dave Macey, we replaced the equalizer and Dave met with installers to balance the system to work properly in our sanctuary. He also detected abnormal sound coming through the cable, figured out the cause, and resolved those issues. It so happens that our Zoom operator, Linda Gerding, will miss the next couple of weeks, so it is a perfect time to make the switch from Zoom to YouTube.

You can access the YouTube Livestream in one of two ways. The easiest method is to access the stream by a link that will come to you via an email from Sherry. The email link will be sent out on the Friday or Saturday before the service.

The second method if you don't have an email account is to go directly to YouTube and search for the stream. We suggest you "subscribe" to our YouTube channel for a better experience and the ability to "chat" with us using the Chat feature. To search for our stream, follow these steps:

- 1. In your browser, go to www.youtube.com.
- 2. Search for St. Matthew's (using the little magnifying glass) by typing St Matthews Raytown
- 3. Search for the upcoming livestream (or the one in progress if you join after the stream has started.)

The most recent stream will NOT be at the top, so you'll need to scroll down your screen until you find the latest service.

Regardless of the method you use to access the stream, let us know you are at the service by simply saying, "Good Morning, this is Linda" or by saying, "Hi, this is Barb" when we pass the peace. If you want to really make Linda Gerding happy, say "Hi, this is Rick - kit" so she knows you will be using a communion kit during the Eucharist. This will help her to record your attendance properly after the service.

We hope you will make use of the YouTube stream whenever you can't attend in person. You can even watch later if you can't get on live at 10:00 a.m. YouTube is also a great way for those who live out of town to join us. We have seen Sherry and Jim Minzey, Kay Gutierrez, and Lorrie Taylor on the stream. Invite your out-of-town friends or family to join us, then come back and say "Hi" during the peace.

Although we won't be able to verbally chat with each other like we're use to on Zoom, we can still "chat" with the chat feature on YouTube. I hope you will make use of YouTube whenever you can't be with us in person. "See" you on the stream!

Help Us With the Stream

Now that St. Matthew's will be live for all to see, we can use a little help showing our best side. Please help us in the following ways:

- 1. Observe quiet time prior to the start of the Prelude. Everything that is said can potentially be heard and will exist in perpetuity online. Sound is magnified, so even a whisper or quiet voice can potentially be picked up by the microphone.
- 2. If you sit toward the back, please try not to sit right on the aisle seat, particularly on the back left (as you face front) as those seats are directly in the line of sight of the camera.
- 3. Remember when you come to the back of the church, you will likely be blocking the camera. Please try to use the outer aisles when you go to the restroom or otherwise come to the back.
- 4. Try not to talk with the camera operator as she will be trying (sometimes with difficulty) to get the stream going and sometimes has a difficult time conversing.
- 5. The stream will be live for a short time following the service, so be careful talking too loudly as it will probably be recorded.
- 6. If you are setting up the altar before the service, please close the flower room door when you are finished as it looks bad on the stream.

Helping us in the above ways will allow us to put on a professional and dignified church service. Your help is *greatly* appreciated!
