Dear Church family,

It's hard to believe that the Advent and Christmas season is breaking upon us! We attempt to remember and reflect on this paradox of living between the first and second coming of Jesus. Furthermore, we are

asked to wrestle with this dynamic in one of the busiest and hectic of the year. It takes patience to practice this art of quieting our minds to ponder these grand truths. We are intentionally waiting on Christ's Second coming while we are preparing anew to receive the babe who was laid in the manger amidst shopping and Christmas parties.

Advent challenges us to be ready and awake for the Second Coming of Christ by reminding us how it was in the days of Noah when people got distracted by the normal processes of daily living. We might respond, "We have to eat and drink, we have to get married you know, we have to work overtime when the boss asks us, right? Paying attention and preparation are vital we are exhorted.

Advent reminds us that the best part of our discipleship is making preparation for Jesus Christ to feel at home in us. "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths", Isaiah calls to us through John the Baptist, this last O.T. prophet who is eager to help us get ready for Jesus. I am reminded of the Charlie Brown Christmas Special that we all watch each year. Charles Schultz was cautioned by the directors about Linus reading the Nativity story from Luke on prime-time TV! The gospel was presented to millions that night in spite of the possibility the public would reject it. What did they sing at the end of the show but "Hark the Herald the Angel's Sing." And notice the portion of that stanza in verse 4, "Fix in us thy humble home." Thank God for that Anglican hymn writer in Methodist disguise, Charles Wesley! Truly we should repent
