The 2022 St. Matthew's Annual Parish Meeting was held Sunday, January 29th following the 10:00 a.m. service. Prior to the meeting, we enjoyed three kinds of soup, compliments of Christina Brooks, who brought beef vegetable soup and vegetable soup (both delicious) and Beth Cook, who brought chicken noodle soup (which I heard was delicious but everyone beat me to it!) After everyone had their fill, the annual meeting commenced with a prayer by Fr. Jeff Hurst. Last year's minutes were approved and Fr. Jeff presented his report as well as the parish statistics. Treasurer Dave Macey presented the annual financials and 2023 budget, which was approved by the congregation.

The Sr. Warden made her report and announced that Fr. Jeff, whose contract expires at the end of February, has been offered a new, open-ended contract, which he accepted. The Sr. Warden also welcomed two new members: Lorrie Taylor and Peggy Sutherland, and set forth her goals for the coming year. The first goal for 2023 is to bring internet downstairs into the parish hall so that online attendees can come to coffee hour and attend programs in the parish hall. The second goal is to improve the online experience by ensuring that those who attend from a distance (Sherry and Jim Minzey, Lorrie Taylor) and those who travel out of town or stay home due to illness or other reasons have communion kits. Kits have already been sent to Sherry and Jim, Lorrie Taylor, and Dave and Francis Macey. Everyone was encouraged to have a couple of kits on hand in case they had to travel or stay home due to illness.

The Nominating Committee, led by Christina Brooks, presented three nominees to serve a two-year term: Carl Turlin, Linda Gerding, and Rick Roberts. All three agreed to serve. The remainder of the meeting featured reports from committee chairs, ministry commissions, and leaders of other parish activities. We closed the meeting with an invitation to the new vestry to attend an organizational meeting immediately following the annual meeting, and Fr. Jeff closed us out with a prayer.

Happy New Year! I want to thank the Vestry and the congregation for the Christmas gift. I greatly appreciate it and plan to use it toward music that I can use for preludes, interludes and postludes. I keep looking for music that I think all will like so this gift will be very helpful.

Speaking of voluntary instrumental music: I want to help you understand why preludes are common at Sunday services. A prelude is a musical piece that helps to prepare ourselves for worship. It's like an introduction for something that is about to happen which of course is the service. It's usually played on an organ or piano and sometimes there will be a singer to listen to. It is sometimes very hard to get ourselves calm and quiet so that our hearts and minds are open to God's presence, so the music is planned to allow us to make that happen.

I guess it may be obvious that I'm headed to a request. Whenever we are in a position to hear a prelude all visiting and commotion should stop, allowing for all to be ready to participate in the service so that we are ready to absorb the lessons of the day, the hymns that support the readings and prayers, the sermons that give us much to think about and the gift of communion.

On the subject of the hymns, I am going to be choosing more hymns that are familiar to most of the congregation, so sing your heart out with joy! I'm aware that many hymns aren't easy to sing, but I hope you know that they are always chosen to enrich everything we experience in our worship. The most important thing is that they are meant to praise God and show him our love and presence. "He who sings," said St. Augustine, "prays twice."

So, when you have questions or suggestions about our music please talk with me or with a choir member. We're open to suggestions, like your favorite hymn or least favorite! I always appreciate your support of me and of the singers who so faithfully volunteer their time and talent. Let us know what you think.

As we get ready for the Lenten Season, I would like to draw our attention to our yearly participation in the weekly observance of the **Stations of the Cross.** We are blessed to have Linda Gerding, Patti McGill and Judy Roberts to lead us in this holy time. We will gather at 6 pm the first Friday after the 1st Sunday of Lent, March 3rd, and then have a light meatless dinner afterwards in the undercroft. We will observe the Stations throughout the Lenten Season each Friday through Good Friday on April 7th. We encourage everyone to attend as many of these services as possible.



The Stations of the Cross or the **Way of the Cross**, also known as the **Way of Sorrows** or the **Via Crucis**, refers to a series of images depicting Jesus Christ on the day of his crucifixion and accompanying prayers. The stations grew out of imitations of the <u>Via Dolorosa</u> in <u>Jerusalem</u>, which is a traditional processional route symbolizing the actual path Jesus walked. I was in Jerusalem in 1996 and walked part of that route and always wished to go there and walk it someday. The objective of the stations is to help the Christian faithful to make a spiritual pilgrimage through contemplation of the Passion of Christ. It has become one of the most popular devotions and the stations can be found in many <u>Western Christian</u> churches, including Lutheran, Methodist, Anglicans and a host of others.

As you can see in our church nave along the walls, a series of 14 images which are stations of small plaques with reliefs or paintings placed and arranged in numbered order along a path, along which worshippers—individually or in a procession—move in order, stopping at each station to say prayers and engage in reflections associated with that station. These devotions are mostly observed during Lent and are to inspire an attitude of repentance as one reflects on the sufferings and insults that Jesus endured during his passion. As a physical devotion it might involve standing, kneeling and genuflections as you feel comfortable.

We hope to see many of you there this Lenten season.
