


LENT, HOLY WEEK and EASTER

Let's remember that the **Ash Wednesday service falls on Feb** 14th will be observed at 7 pm with imposition of ashes and the Eucharist.

Stations of the Cross will begin on the first Friday after **Ash Wednesday on Feb 23rd** and will be observed at 6:00 pm for 5 Fridays through March 22^{nd.} A light supper is planned after the approximately half an hour service. Linda Gerding, Patti McGill , Fr Jeff and Judy Roberts will lead us in these services.

We will prepare the church building for the Lenten season as we gather on Saturday February 17th to cover the crosses in purple before the **First Sunday in Lent on February 18th**. Father Jeff will lead us in a discussion about Holy Week and the Easter season afterwards. Let's all try and meet at 10 am.

James Laney discovered a nice article concerning the Lenten Season that we used last year which has been sent to you by email and will be available in print too.

Palm Sunday is March 24th in the 10 am morning service which will begin with the blessing of the palms in the nave. People will be invited to process around the church outside and reenter to begin the service. After the Palm Sunday service, volunteers will set up the altar of repose for the upcoming Maundy Thursday watch night at the altar of repose

Our **Maundy Thursday** service is March 28th observed at 7 pm. Foot washing and hand washing will be offered with the Eucharist followed by the stripping of the altar and observing the watch service at the altar or repose. Linda Gerding will have a sign- up sheet for those who desire to observe blocks of time for devotion.

Good Friday service will be observed on March 29th at 12 pm. A narrative from John's gospel will be observed. Devotion to the cross will be offered.

Easter Sunday is March 29th at 10 am. We are hoping for great attendance and some worshipful assistance from our choir.

Did you see these markings at each entrance to the church building on January 7th Epiphany Sunday? It is called "Chalking the Door" and is a way to celebrate and physically mark the occasion of the Epiphany and God's blessing of our lives and homes throughout the year. It is sometimes referred to as "holy graffiti". The letters C, M, B, come from the traditional names for the wise men: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar, whose arrival at Mary and Joseph's home is celebrated on the Epiphany.

The letters are also an abbreviation for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which means "May Christ bless this dwelling ". The first and last numbers refer to the current year and the plus signs in between represent the cross.



A few ladies from the parish (Linda Gerding, Zella Forsythe, Patti McGill, Peggy Sutherland, and Janet Anderson-Brown) gathered at the front door of the parish, before the service, to read from Proverbs, say the prayers, and "chalk the door ".

Father Jeff had printed out the short chalking ceremony and bought chalk so each parishioner could have them to take home and bless their own homes for the New Year. May Christ bless us all.

Last night three of us got the opportunity to go to a movie which was being shown across the country on January 23 only.


