
BLESSING A VERY SPECIAL BIBLE



Father Coppinger gave us a flyer announcing a Central Deanery Choir Festival which will be held Saturday, October 14th at St. Paul's. Lee's Summit. This festival is open to anyone who likes to sing, and, of course, all choir members all over the

deanery. It will begin in the morning and end in the afternoon with a concert of the music learned that day.

There was a discussion of the narrative budget for 2024. The Standing Committee is working very hard to choose the right Bishop for us when interim Bishop Diane has served the 3 years contracted. Someone suggested that we clone Bishop Diane. There was also a discussion about the money designated for Nourish KC.
