That is the goal of the use of our prayer book and the time we spend in study and practice. May our hearts burn within us as we pray!

Let us truly experience a holy and happy Lenten season. Easter is just around the corner!

Thanks to Head Usher Rick Roberts, St. Matthew's was able to hold the Annual Pancake Supper in the Fellowship Hall instead of via Zoom like in 2021 and 2022! Rick was again able to schedule the catering help of "Two Men & A Grill" (actually 1 guy,1 gal and 2 grills) to carry on the tradition of "Charlie Matson's Pancake Supper". All you can eat pancakes, sausage, juice and coffee were provided at a cost of \$5.00 per adult and \$3.00 for children. The Ushers Group (Linda Gerding, Rick Roberts and Pat Whitmore) along with several volunteers from the congregation (Jim & Brenda Laney, Zella Forsythe, Carl Turlin, Christina Brooks, Patti McGill, and Jordan Wagstaff), served everyone and then pitched in for an easy cleanup. The Caterers had again provided paper goods for the event, eliminating the need to use the dishwasher. (except for the silverware, other than that Pat Whitmore washed by hand and refolded into clean napkins.)

Attendance was about 115 this year with several guests coming from the Stone Chapel Building. "Carry-out" was again also provided and was taken advantage of by several people. Rick & Judy Robert's son-in-law, David Fox broke the record he set in 2018 (21 pancakes-14 sausages) eating 22 pancakes-15 sausages! He always gets his money's worth!

This event is not intended to be a fundraiser, but a social activity prior to the Season of Lent. Mardi Gras attire was encouraged and welcomed. Thanks to several guests making donations we were able to pay the Caterer's bill of \$575 (plus a \$40 tip to the cook and server) and deposit \$65 profit into the Usher's Fund. A big THANK YOU to the Ushers, Dave Macey for printing the tickets, Sherry Minzey for the Flyers, Janie Matson for "Charlie's placemats", and everyone else who helped sell tickets and invite friends. REFURBISHED PARISH SIGN


