

In just a few days, we will gather for our Diocesan Convention. We will come together to elect deputies to General Convention, as well as members of the Standing Committee, the Diocesan Council, the Commission on Ministry, and the Board of Examining Chaplains. We will also be voting on resolutions and on the Plan for Ministry. These are all important decisions for the Diocese of West Missouri. We won't agree on every issue, and some may be disappointed their favorite candidates were not elected to open offices. There may be things said that some may not agree with and others may love. That is part of what coming together in convention can bring out among us as siblings in Christ in the Diocese of West Missouri.

One thing I trust is the movement of the Holy Spirit. It may not always move the way I would prefer, but I trust in the Holy Spirit to move us to we learn to have a civil conversation with those around us? Our Presiding Bishop has developed a program called *From Many, One: Conversations Across Difference*. This work is available in English and in Spanish for churches, vestries, bishop's committees, and individuals to use. Centering around four questions, the guide and videos show us a way to listen to each other even when we disagree on issues. I commend this work to you all.

As we come together in a few days at our Diocesan Convention, I want to remind you of something I shared from my first *From the Mission Field* with you all: the Bishop's Address from the Journal of the Primary Convention of The Diocese of West Missouri held at Grace Church in Kansas City on June 3-4, 1890, offered by the Rt. Rev. Daniel Tuttle, Bishop of Missouri and Provisional Bishop of West Missouri. I was struck by the following where we need to be as a diocese. You will notice at this convention that more times of prayer are built into the business session of the meeting by chaplains who will be praying for all of us through the convention. We need their prayers. We need ALL of our prayers. We will also have a commissioning service at the end of the business session for all who have been elected.

By trusting the Spirit and offering our work in prayer, the Church sets a powerful and countercultural example. While the culture around us defaults to mistrust and entrenched divisions, we need to work together to model walking the way of love that Jesus taught and about which our Presiding Bishop has spoken so eloquently. This is not only true for our Diocesan Convention, but also for our communities of faith, our cities, counties, and states. We need to see it not just in church gatherings but in electoral campaigns. How do we learn to speak together and truly listen to each other? How can we engage people across the divides that seem to separate us? How can words, which I have excerpted and offer to you:

"Yours is a glorious Missionary field. Talk Missions, work Missions, love Missions from the very start. All around the horizon, there is Missionary work for you, and that, too, of a most promising kind... Kansas City, St. Joseph, Springfield, Sedalia, Carthage, ye that



are strong, I beg you uphold the weak. I beseech you as for your life, stand by the Missionary work... Here and now, you are to give tone to your Diocese. You are to start the making of its future history. Be prudent, prayerful, earnest, kindly, unselfish, generous."

Let us come together in a few days, and work together in the months ahead, to strengthen this Diocese, focused on the words of Bishop Tuttle so that we may recall our roots to grow anew.






Painting
