




HELP ON THE ALTAR

This meant the walk route was new as well, but could still be as long (3.5mi) or as short (1.1mi) as anyone wanted to walk. It was a cool morning and mostly cloudy, but St. Matthew's Team showed up, like our t-shirts state "Here I am Lord".

The faithful and steadfast support of St. Matthew's Church and friends had them making donations right up to the day of the walk. A Matching Grant request to the Diocese has been submitted by Linda Gerding. St. Matthew's has been faithful for many years to represent our Parish in its efforts to donate to help in the fight against world hunger. For 3 years the Diocese has granted our Matching Grant request, and hopefully they will again this year.

St. Matthew's raised \$520.00 this year, the most it has raised in several years. With the approval of the Matching Grant from the Diocese \$1,040.00 will be donated to Church World Service in behalf of St. Matthew's. A BIG THANKS goes to the very appreciated generosity of the following:
